<u>Dr Maryanne Coutts</u>, Subject Leader in Drawing, National Art School, Sydney

Painter Maryanne Coutts completed a PHD at the University of Ballarat in 1996 and has taught at Monash University, the Australian Catholic University and the National Art School. Her thick, weighty gouache and watercolour works depict ambiguous, dark and often unsettling landscapes and anonymous figures. Coutts' work has been included in group exhibitions throughout Australia. She was awarded the Portia Geach Memorial Award in 2007. Her work is held by several regional and tertiary collections.

<u>Matthys Gerber</u>, Senior Lecturer, Painting - Sydney College of the Arts, University of Sydney

Matthys Gerber is an artist who works primarily with painting and photography.

His work explores the full gamut of painterly genres, skipping deftly between abstraction and representation, embracing contradiction, defying convention and delighting in the rift between high and low art. Matthys Gerber is a Senior Lecturer in Painting at Sydney College of the Arts.

<u>Paula Dawson</u>, Associate Professor, College of Fine Arts, University of NSW

Paula is leading an Australian Research Council funded Discovery project from 2011 till 2015. The aim of the Holoshop project is to forge a set of innovative technologies and processes for creating realtime 3D digital content for holograms and other 3D display systems, with haptic tools which enable the direct hand-drawing of subjects, mark by mark.




