WARNING! (May Contain Nuts)

(Following is an edited version of the opening speech given by Susan Hutchinson, Sat 24 August 2013.).

I would like to first of all recognise the traditional owners of the land on which we are standing.

I would also like to thank John Supe for the invitation to open <u>WARNING!</u> (May Contain Nuts) – the 10th Winners Showcase exhibition.

I asked John how the exhibition title Warning (may contain nuts) come about, as it is a bit out of the ordinary. He emailed me back the list of suggested titles but said this was the overall favourite. John is an artist and a real lateral thinker. I had a laugh at some of the other titles that were suggested including *Free Wine and Cheese*, *Art That Refreshes*, *On Sale Soon* and *Artists Do It Better*. These titles are certainly different than some of the titles from the past ten year – the first one in 2004 was *Various Viewpoints*, in 2007 it was *Diverse Dialogues*, 2010 it was *Oxford St*, *Smithfield* and last year *9 for 9*. Many of you may remembers these titles and would have been involved in these exhibitions.

WARNING! (May Contain Nuts) is the Fairfield City Arts Society 10th Winners Showcase exhibition. It seem like yesterday that I had a conversation with Fairfield Art Society about what Fairfield City Museum and Gallery could do to recognise and promote the best works of their members. The Winners Showcase was instigated as it gave the prize winning artists an opportunity to experiment and develop a body of work that would be displayed as a series or group. Something that emerging artists rarely have to opportunity to do.

The first Fairfield Art Prize that I saw in 1999 at the Fairfield School of the Arts as part of the Fairfield Arts Festival. What has always impressed me about the Fairfield City Art Prize is the quality of their judging panels. This was also the case in 2012.

The judges for last year's show - the winners whose works you see here today were **Dr. Maryanne Coutts**, Subject Leader in Drawing, National Art School; **Matthys Gerber**, Senior Lecturer Painting, Sydney College of the Arts, University of Sydney and **Paula Dawson**, Associated Professor, College of Fine Arts, University of NSW. Three academic from three different recognised art institution. I must congratulate the Fairfield Art Society in being able to obtain such a good panel of judges. The winners can be proud of the fact that their work was selected by consensus of individuals that are highly respected for experience and expertise in the visual arts.

Last year's Fairfield Art Prize 2012 was the 20th Arts Prize exhibition by the Fairfield Art Society – an achievement in itself. I would like to congratulate the winners who are showing their works here today. **Shen Wednesday** and **Patricia Johnson** winners in the Traditional awards; the winners in the Contemporary awards **Len Hurley**, **Joanne Absolom** (whose work was on the invitation) and Nika **Norman**, and finally winners of Works on Paper awards **John Supe**, **Charlie Wells** and **Cilla Davis**.

Please take the opportunity to talk to the artists about their work after the opening.

Winning in the Fairfield Art Prize is recognition by the arts community of the artistic endeavours of these artists, of their skills, thought processes and manner of expression. It is important that individuals are recognised for the area in which they excel - be it at work, at school, in sport, in writing, in dance, as a chef or whatever. These artists are also important in inspiring others to have a go and produce their best works.

Today we have here only the winners of the adult section of the Fairfield Art Prize. For me the most important section of the Fairfield Art Prize is the youth section. Over the years I have seen this section of the art Prize grow and the works within it continually improve. that they will continue to draw, paint and create now or in the future. Fairfield Art Society and art teachers in the local area PLEASE KEEP UP the good work that you do with the youth of Fairfield. This year the youth section had 54 student entries from 43 different individuals ranging in age from 5 - 15 years old. Some children may not be good at sport or in school but what a thrill for them to see their works exhibited and judged at the Marconi Club, along with the works similar these here. What an inspiration for these artists. We hope we are encouraging them to develop their artistic talents.

The Fairfield Arts Society stated in Cabramatta in the 1961 and was known as the Cabramatta And Districts Art Society. Founder of the group, Evelyn Healy is recognised for her contribution to the art in Fairfield on a bollard on the footpath in front of the Fairfield School of the Arts. Next time you pass by this are stop and read about her interesting life. The group first meet at Evelyn's in her studio in the converted iron shanty home in Cabramatta. There is still one of the original members of the group alive - Ted Wales. He is 103 and still painting and recently had a solo show at Fairfield City Museum and Gallery curated by Fairfield Art Society. The main reason the group was formed over 52 years ago was to share ideas and encourage others in their art practice. The same Fairfield Art Society is still active today 52 years later.

The Fairfield Art Society has developed and changed over the 52 years. Artworks have adjusted to modern styles and incorporated new materials and techniques. The Society's continued development has made Fairfield City a richer more rounded community for their efforts. I would like to recognize the time and effect put into the society by three of its current members **John Supe**, **Lorraine Maggs** and **Joe Briffa**. They along with their many helpers have ensure that in the Fairfield community art and creativity is still encouraged, as in the vision of Evelyn Healy and those who formed the group back in the 1960s.

Congratulations to all those involved in the 10th Winners Showcase exhibition for playing their part in creative community development. I would like to declare "WARNING! (May Contain Nuts)" open.


