# President's Report for year ending 30 November 2014

The activities of our Art Society during the past twelve months were as follows:

Our previous AGM was held as announced, on Monday, 9th December 2013 in the Sports Association Office at the back of the Mezzanine level (Club Marconi). **Delfina Pipitone** was Returning Officer.

The AGM was followed by our End of Year "Dr. Zeus Theme" Function, which included artistic "presentations", and our usual Trivia Quiz. The Quiz was again composed, orchestrated, and conducted by our Trivia Master **Steve McLaren**. In a very closely-run contest **Leane Stitzinger** won the rare honour of keeping our "*Good-Ship Arts-Alive Travelling Trophy*" for the duration of 2014.

Beginning Monday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2014 we held <u>7 Monthly Meetings</u> (second Monday each Month). All of these were open and minuted management-committee meetings.

In addition to the Monthly Meetings, micelf(JJ), Joe Briffa, Lorraine Maggs, and other Committee members, attend a number of meetings amongst ourselves, and also meetings with representatives of the Marconi Board of Directors and Club management, and also represent us at important annual Club Marconi Functions, Club Grant Ceremonies, etc. Some notable examples:

- Joe Briffa, as our representative, regularly attends monthly meetings of the <u>Club Marconi Sports & Cultural Associations</u>, which are chaired by Mr Mario Soligo, Club Marconi Vice President and Sports President. Joe also regularly prepares and submits our "Art Association" articles in the "Marconi Wire" magazine.
  Unfortunately this Sunday 6th April annual Club Marconi <u>Sports Carnivale</u>, was washed out.
- Joe, Lorraine, Nika Norman, Steve McLaren and Ron Stitzinger represented our Association at the annual Club Marconi <u>Chestnut Day</u>, Sunday27th April. They provided a comprehensive Children's Face-Painting service, on a warm sunshiny sausage-sizzle sort of day
- Similarly, **Nika** and **Lorraine** represented us with Children's Face-Painting activities at Club Marconi's <u>Italian Republic</u> <u>Day</u> celebrations and festivities, till bad weather set in, on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> June.
- Lorraine and Joe represented our art society at a Club Grants Function on 7<sup>th</sup> Aug at Mount Pritchard Social Club. Then JJ and Leane & Ron Stitzinger did same at another Club Grants Ceremony on 27<sup>th</sup> Aug, also at St Johns Park Bowling Club.

Every Monday night, outside school holidays, Nika Norman has organised <u>Art Classes</u> in the Bocce area, Club Marconi. These classes are for adults and children to expand their artistic abilities.

This year **Joe** and **JJ** produced **three** "<u>Arts Alive</u>" <u>Newsletters</u>. Covering Jan 2014 to Jan 2015, these were issue numbers 62 to 64 inclusive. Besides <u>three</u> Folding & Stuffing meetings with **Ron Stitzinger**, **Joe** & **JJ** as Co-Editors, have Editorial meetings in preparing the newsletter for publishing. Joe also personally printed these editions (as we/he also do/es with our Exhibition Catalogues for Openings).

The morning of Sunday 19 Oct was spent by **Joe** and **Steve Mclaren** on maintenance and painting of our Fifteen white screens just prior to the hanging of the Fairfield Art Prize Exhibition.

And just last Friday the 5<sup>th</sup>, Joe, Steve, Leane and Ron, spent all day restoring, refurbishing and repainting the Club's Christmas Nativity Crib (under stairs near the front escalators).

And now, to what we are really about -

This year we successfully organised **<u>Eight Major Exhibitions.</u>** Chronologically they were ;

<u>Giovanni Tozzetti -- Solo Exhibition</u> in our Artist Corner. Giovanni, a past President of our FCAS, and multi-award winning artist, exhibited his wonderful abstract paintings, and were well enjoyed by many Club Marconi patrons from 17<sup>th</sup> February till 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

John Rice – Solo Exhibition from 25<sup>th</sup> March till 4<sup>th</sup> May in our Artists Corner, we were all able to enjoy the atmospheric landscapes of our very popular local High School principal John Rice.

2014 FCAS Member's Prize Exhibition (the 47th "Annual Exhibition"), Mezzanine area of Club Marconi, was officially opened Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May, by Mario Soligo (Club Marconi Vice-President) and Delfina Pipitone (Club Board). Exhibition was open to the public from 5<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> May.

Also speaking at the Opening was the exhibition judge Nicolas Tsoutas, Stedman Visual Arts Lecturer, Sydney College

of Arts, University of Sydney.

<u>Category First Prize winners</u> were **Filomena Vanzanella** (Trad), **Cheryl Tate** (Cont), and **Pamela Rodoreda** (W on P). The winner of the annual \$2000 <u>Club Marconi</u> "Best in Show" Acquisitive-Prize was Linda Brescia with her "*Memories Die With Us*". Many thanks and much applause to **Club Marconi** for sponsoring this ongoing *feature* addition to our yearly exhibition program. *Bravo!* 

**2014 Member's Prize Showcase Of Winners Exib.** All award-winning artworks from our just closed Member's Prize Exhibition, were showcased together, in our Artists Corner from 19<sup>th</sup> May till 29<sup>th</sup> June.

#### Also showing were Patricia Johnston, John Rice, Sybil Barber, Ojars Greste, Dorothy-Rae Sullivan, and Len Hurley.

<u>Patricia Johnston -- Solo Exhibition</u> in our Artist Corner. **Patricia**, a multi-award winning artist, exhibited mostly landscape and still-life paintings, and were viewed many Club Marconi patrons from 29<sup>th</sup> June till 16<sup>th</sup> August.

<u>Beverly and Ron Webster – Duo Exhibition</u> also in our Artists Corner. This married team showed many landscape paintings and a section devoted to canine paintings. This successful show was seen by many 17<sup>th</sup>August till 18<sup>th</sup> October.

2014 Fairfield Art Prize our "22<sup>nd</sup> Annual FAP Exhibition", was Opened by Guy Zangari MP (State Member for Fairfield) and Mario Soligo (Club Marconi Vice-President) on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> October (Open to public 20<sup>th</sup> Oct till 2<sup>nd</sup> November ).

The <u>exhibition judge</u> was **Dr Adam Geczy** (Senior Lecturer, Sculpture and Art Theory, Sydney College of Arts, University of Sydney).

Category First Prize winners were again Filomena Vanzanella (Trad), Renate Fisher (Cont) and again Renate Fisher (W on P).

**2014 Fairfield Art Prize Showcase Of Winners Exib.** All award-winning artworks from our recently closed Fairfield Art Prize Exib, are showcased together, in our Artists Corner from the 3<sup>rd</sup> November. 
